### 1.1 - Curriculum Planning and Implementation

#### 1.1.1 - Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

Every Department has a functional mechanism for the proper delivery of the curriculum. Every year we set necessary goals in the area of teaching, administration and evaluation process for our departments as per our University rules and regulations, keeping in mind the overall success of our students. The Departmental Committee meetings are generally held on regular basis for the distribution of the syllabus with flexibility. The teaching plans are formulated keeping in mind the allocation of syllabus and ACADEMIC Calender and the constraints of time of the CBCS system. The departmental teachers are always encouraged to take up new texts and innovative ideas in the teaching learning process. Faculty members of the department take care of for the completion of the syllabus. An evaluation process is also followed up by conducting class tests and class seminars. Sometimes invited lectures are organised on curriculum based topics in which the subject experts of neighbouring colleges are invited as resource persons. The students are always encouraged to participate seminars and workshops held in the college as well as in the other institutions. Besides traditional chalk and talk method of teaching the department accesses ICT enabled facility. Different curricular activities such as presentation, assignments, seminars, group discussion etc. are arranged for effective teaching. Tutorial and remedial classes are taken.

While the formal evaluative process comprises tutorials/projects, class tests and internal assessments, students are encouraged to meet teachers beyond class hours for clearing doubts and textual discussion. Also students have been informed about many computer based techniques for preparing field report and data analysis using different software. Students are also encouraged to use internet for searching materials. Communication skill development techniques are discussed. Students are always encouraged to do field study or survey regarding various social problems for preparation of their projects. Students are imparted awareness regarding women empowerment which reflects the involvement of ex-students in various services like teaching, banking, NGOs health centres and so on. Faculty members are interconnected through whatsapp group for information sharing. There are whatsapp group for each semester involving all faculty members and students of the respective semester. These groups are meant for information sharing. Free softwares from internet are used for programming and plotting. Students are encouraged to use computers and their smartphones for analysis of various problems related programming. Contribution of Nobel Laureates(in Physics) of that particular year is focussed and academic discussion is done. Class notes to the students are sent to their email. For motivating students, award winning science documentaries are shown in the classroom.

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2.5.2 - Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

To follow up a Continuous Internal Evaluation Process the Departments conduct class tests apart from the internal examination stipulated by the University. Results of the test are discussed and weakness of the students are identified through it. After the completion of each topic or chapter the teachers arrange a class test for the evaluation of the students. Question papers are duly

scrutinised by the HODs. After completion of the Internal examination, the faculty evaluate the answer scripts and meet the students individually for clarification of doubts. Marks are displayed on the departmental notice board. Results are duly reviewed at departmental meetings. Attendance of students regularly monitored for the Examination. Assign students small syllabus oriented projects and ask them to submit those papers for review. Encouraging students to give presentation in front of teachers and students to build up their confidence level. Discussion with the Guardian and Counselling of poor students done.

4.4.2 Procedures and policies for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc. (maximum 500 words) (information to be available in institutional Website, provide link) There remains a collective effort to sustain the physical, academic and support facilities by implementing decentralized policy measures. In fact, there is a structural support mechanism for maintaining and utilizing infrastructural facilities. Generally, the grants received from the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal as well as UGC are utilized for the upgradation of the laboratories, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms, canteen facilities. Sometimes, these facilities are also maintained from the college fund. It is worth noting that the infrastructural development also takes place from endowments received from distinguished personalities, institutions and business houses like the fund amounting to Rs. 2,00,000/- (Rupees two lakh) received from P.C. Chandra Group for the upgradation of college library and the donation amounting to Rs. 40,00,000.00/- (Rupees forty lakh) to be received from Dr. Subrata Dutta Chaudhuri for the construction of P.G. Block. ### **6.1 - Institutional Vision and Leadership**

#### **6.1.1 - Mention two practices of decentralization and participative management during the last year (maximum 500 words)**

(i) While Teachers' Day has always been observed by Berhampore Girls' College since its inception, the organization of a central commemoration of the day started from 2013 under the guidance and recommendation of the Governing Body of the college. The observance of the day takes place in the form of a Memorial Lecture in the name of the Founder Principal of the College - Prof Amiya Rao in the name of the Principal under whose tutelage and bower the college flourished - Prof Priti Gupta and the notable littérateur, Dr. Rezaul Karim. Following upon this initiative, the Governing Body also introduced in 2017 the Annual Conferment of Honour on the day to be bestowed upon an esteemed academic personality. The Governing Body framed a policy of decentralization for ensuring participative management at the event by the teaching faculty, students and even non-teaching employees of the institution. In this regard, it deserves mention that a Sub-committee is formed at a staff meeting convened by the Principal of the college. The Principal acts as the chairperson of the Sub-committee with one of the teaching faculty as a Convener including teachers and students as members of the Sub-committee. It is the responsibility of the sub-committee to distribute work amongst all the teachers and students of respective departments for steering the event towards success. The students of all the departments along with their teachers observe Teachers' Day first in a small but unique way at their respective departments till 11.30 a.m. The department-based observation of the event is kept to retain the sentiment of the students for their department. The central observation of the event starts from 12.00 pm. In 2019, the "Prof. Amiya Rao-Priti Gupta-Rezaul Karim 7th Annual Memorial Lecture" was addressed by Prof. Srutinath Chakraborty, Former Professor of Bengali, Vidyasagar University on Bartaman Bangali Jibane OManane Vidyasagarer Prasangikata. The Conferment of Honour was bestowed upon Sri Pulakendu Singha, a social activist and eminent scholar on Folklore. The central observation of the event along with the departmental is aimed towards instilling in the students the feeling of honour and appreciation for the efforts and hard work of the teachers and also to inculcate the spirit of oneness. Similarly teachers are also enthused to receive recognition and appreciation from the dear students. (ii) Although the Choice Based Credit System for undergraduate course was introduced by the affiliating university, the University of Kalyani in the year 2018 as a comprehensive academic programme for the affiliating colleges, quite significantly the implementation of the new structured framework for the programme was implemented throughout the 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 academic sessions. The policy of decentralization is duly initiated by the

college on receiving the new regulations from the university. The college authority duly formulated a policy decision for organizing workshops in each department to address the issues concerning the new structure and framework of the syllabus. Generally, the University gets the recommendation of the college through representation in the Board of Studies. The University introduced the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) at the Undergraduate level in 2018 and developed a new Course Curriculum assuring adequate emphasis on academic flexibility and choice of the students. Berhampore Girls' College initiated to implement the new system and Course Curriculum designed by the University with utmost interest. Similarly, three regular Post Graduation Programmes (Bengali, English and History) are running in the college under the same structure of CBCS and follow the Course Curriculum designed by the affiliating University.</p>
Teaching and Learning	<p>The college authority takes special initiative to make emphasis on teaching-learning process with scientific methods and innovations. The college also looks into the upgradation of science laboratories with modern instruments and equipment from time to time.</p>

<p>Examination and Evaluation</p>	<p>□ Examination and Evaluation: The affiliating university, University of Kalyani gives Academic Calendar to the colleges. The affiliating college prepares its own Academic Calendar based on it. The University provides the Routine for examination of New Pattern (III) Part 1,2 3 Examination as well as Semester based Examination. Regarding evaluation of answer scripts by respective teachers, it is prepared by the University Board of Studies of respective departments. Evaluation of answer scripts of Internal Examination by departmental teachers is prepared at the Departmental Committee meetings of respective departments. It deserves mention that during the 2019-2020 academic session, two system of examinations was functional - the three year degree course pattern as well as the semester based examination. After the University gives the Routine, the Convener of the Academic Committee initiates a meeting in consultation with the Principal of the college. At the meeting, a Roster is prepared for conducting the University Examinations as well as the Test Examination for three year degree course and Internal examination for semester system. Both the University and Test/Internal Examinations take place on the basis of the Roster. -2: Alternative functional method for the sustenance of teaching-learning process during the pandemic: It is worth noting that Berhampore Girls' College has always ensured full time academic connectivity with students prior to the outbreak of the Covid19 pandemic through different online methods. To complete the technical vetting of the projects concerning the constructions of a) G5 New Academic Building, b) Auditorium and c) Toilet Block and submit the same to the Department of Minority Affairs, Government of West Bengal for financial support. 4. To install two solar panel projects: (i) 20 kilowatt on the roof of the old administrative cum academic building under WBREDA (West Bengal Renewable Energy Development Authority) (ii) 10 kilowatt on the roof of the Science Block under West Bengal Pollution Control Board. 5. To take necessary steps for the proper functioning of the established Local Swayam Chapter at Berhampore Girls’ College under EMRC, St. Xavier’s College (Autonomous), Kolkata. 6. To organize value-based certificate courses in association with and under the guidance of Ramakrishna Mission Vidyamandira, Belur, West Bengal. 7. To implement the provision of Institutional Research Grant to teaching faculty of the institution of which necessary terms and conditions have already been accomplished. 8. Keeping in perspective the Covid 19 pandemic situation, decision has been taken to organize online seminars on the pandemic for creating social awareness amongst all the stakeholders. 9. To ensure proper implementation of online teaching-learning process as an alternative method by creating awareness of the digital teaching and learning tools to be utilized by the teachers and students. 10.To complete the construction of New Girls’ Hostel with the fund received under the Multi Sectoral Development Programme.
